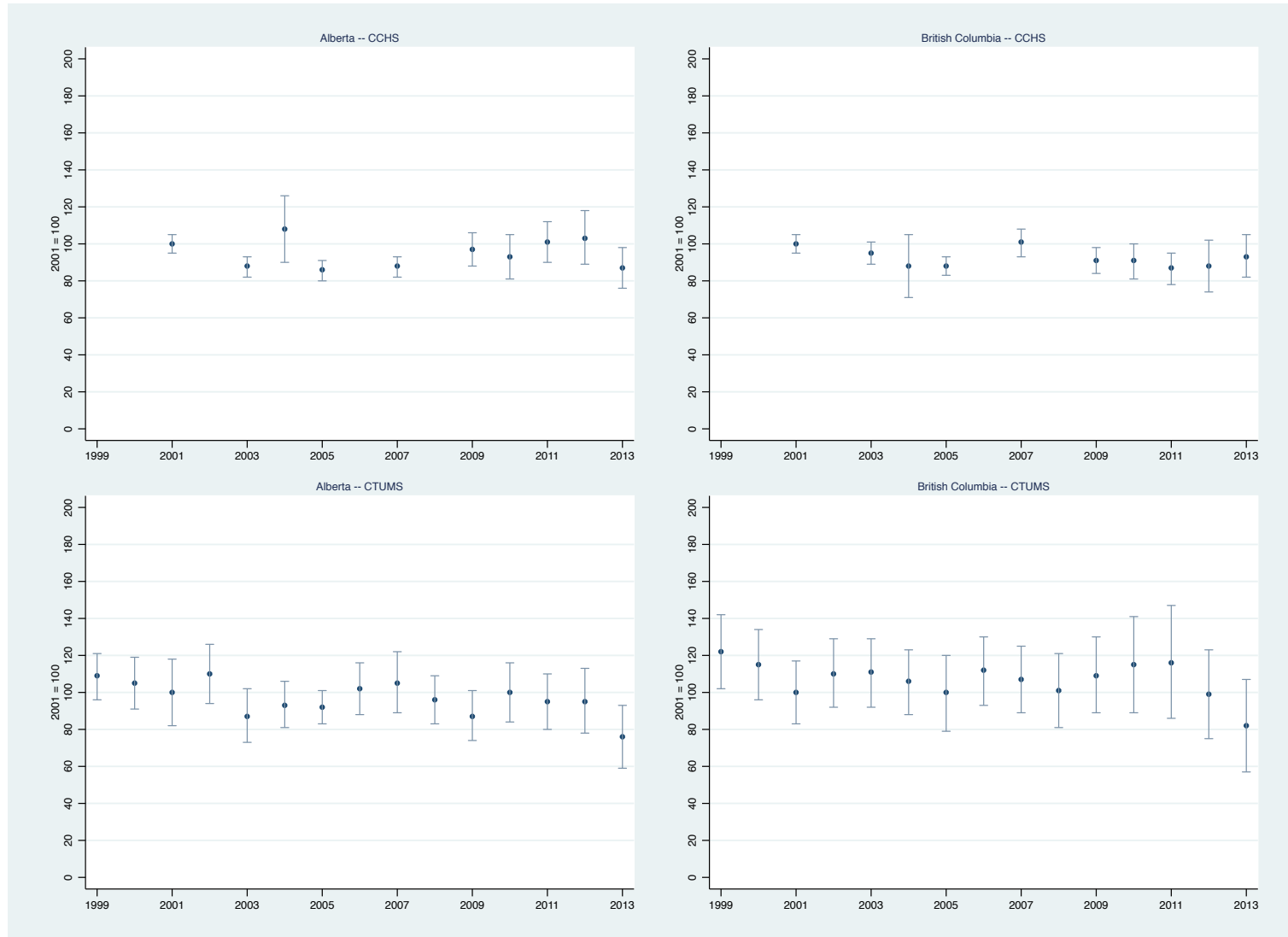

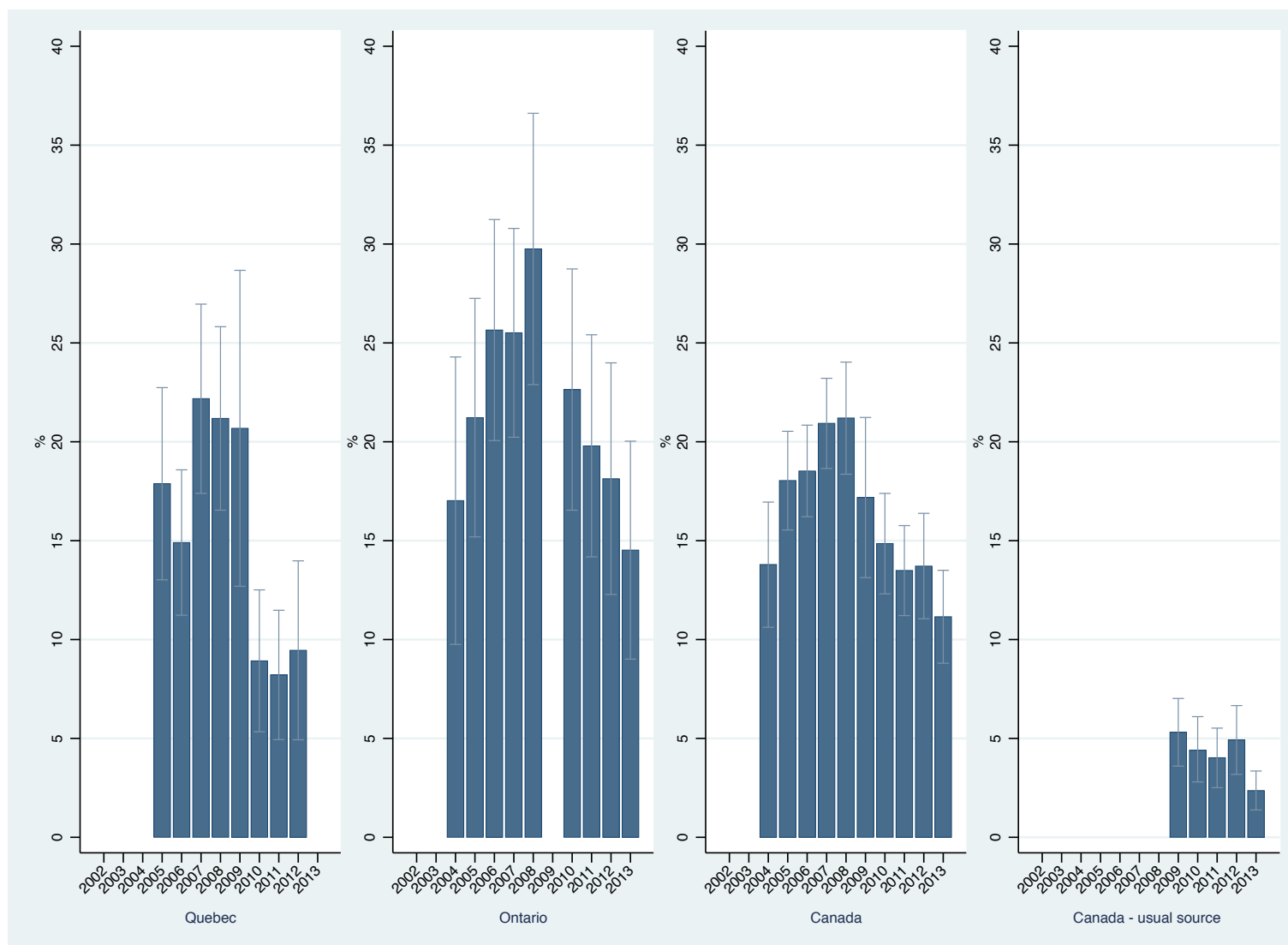


Figure A3. Percentage of smokers reporting a First Nations reserve as the source of their last purchase of cigarettes, Ontario, 2002-2013.

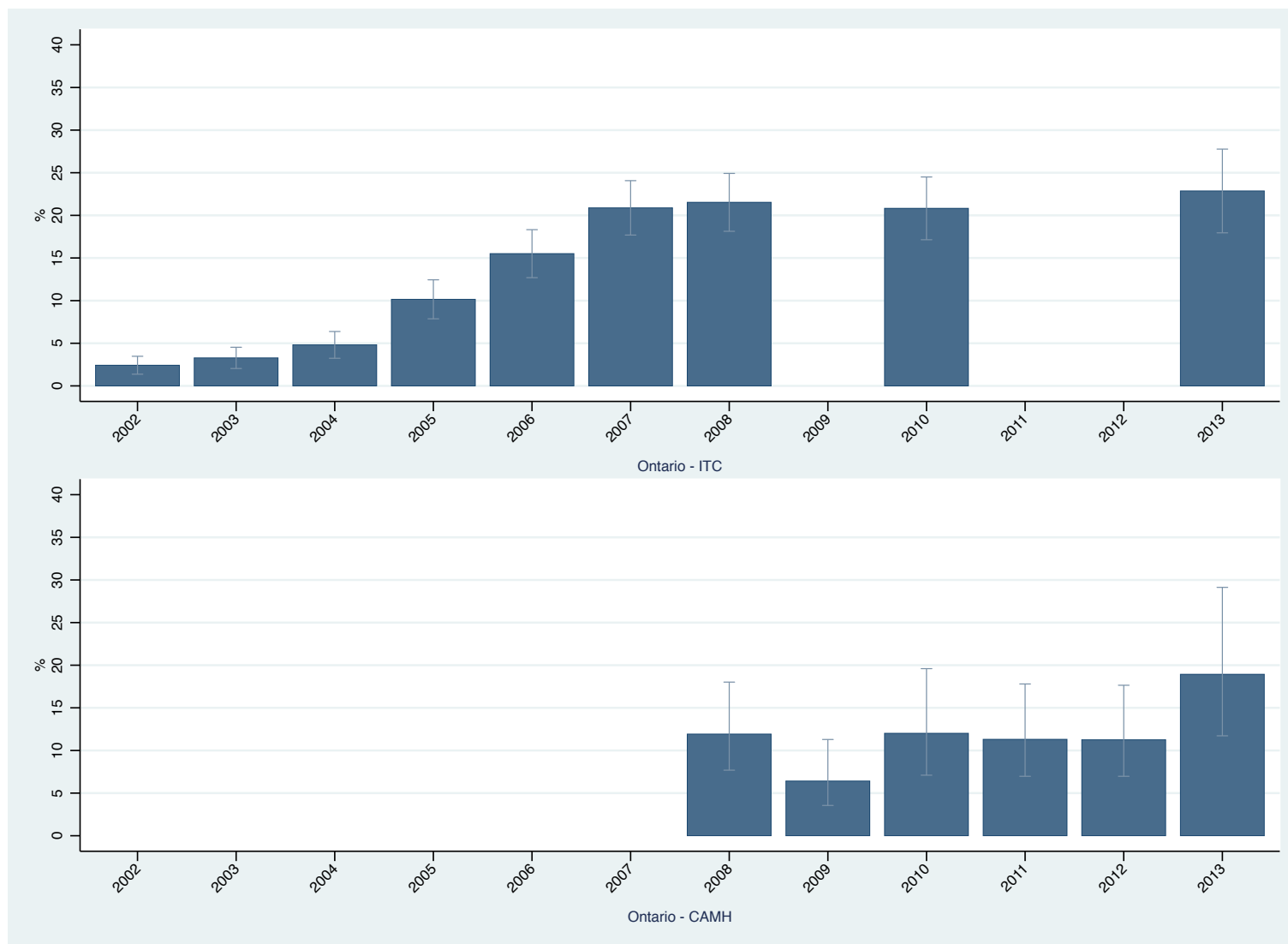

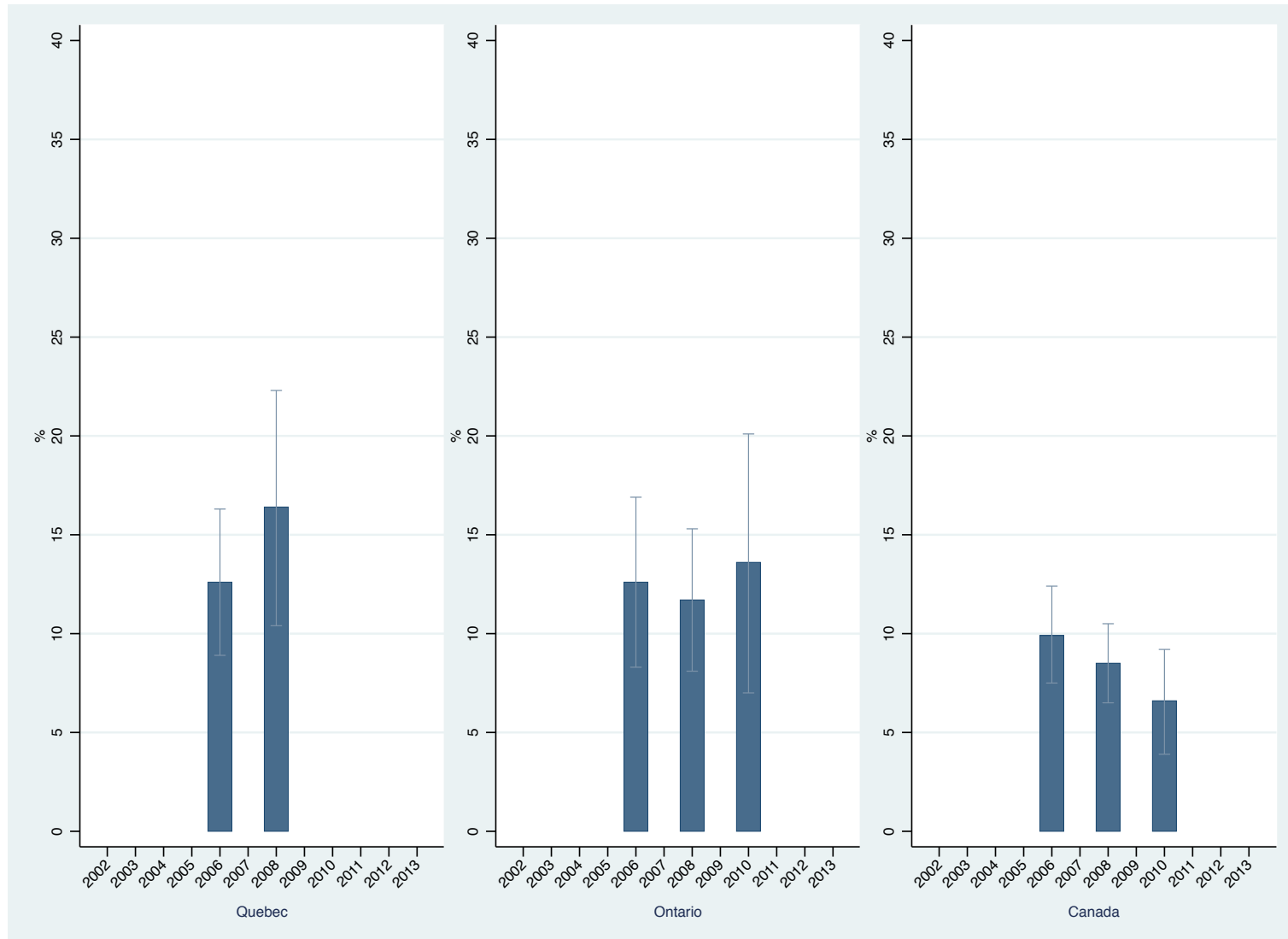

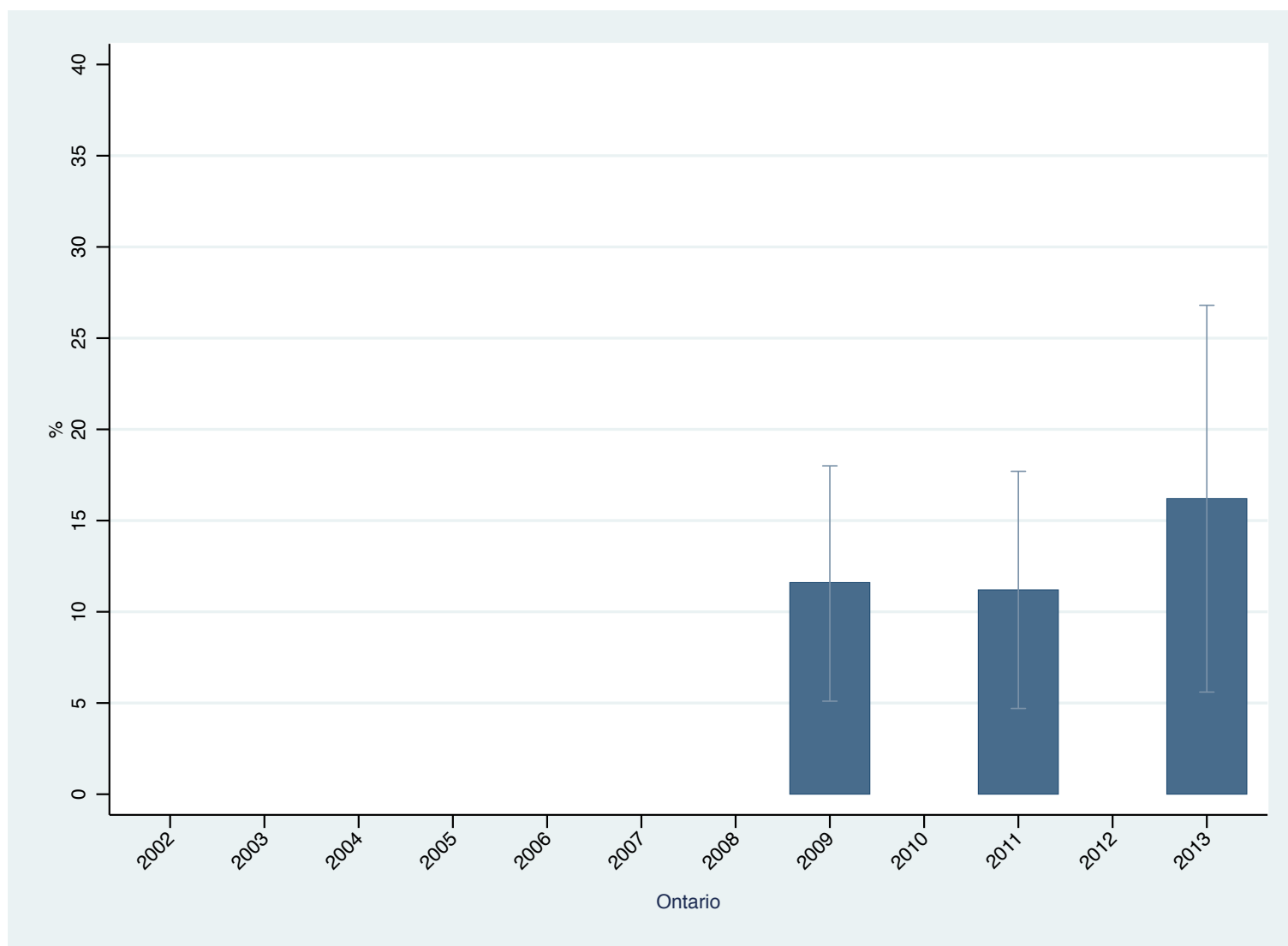

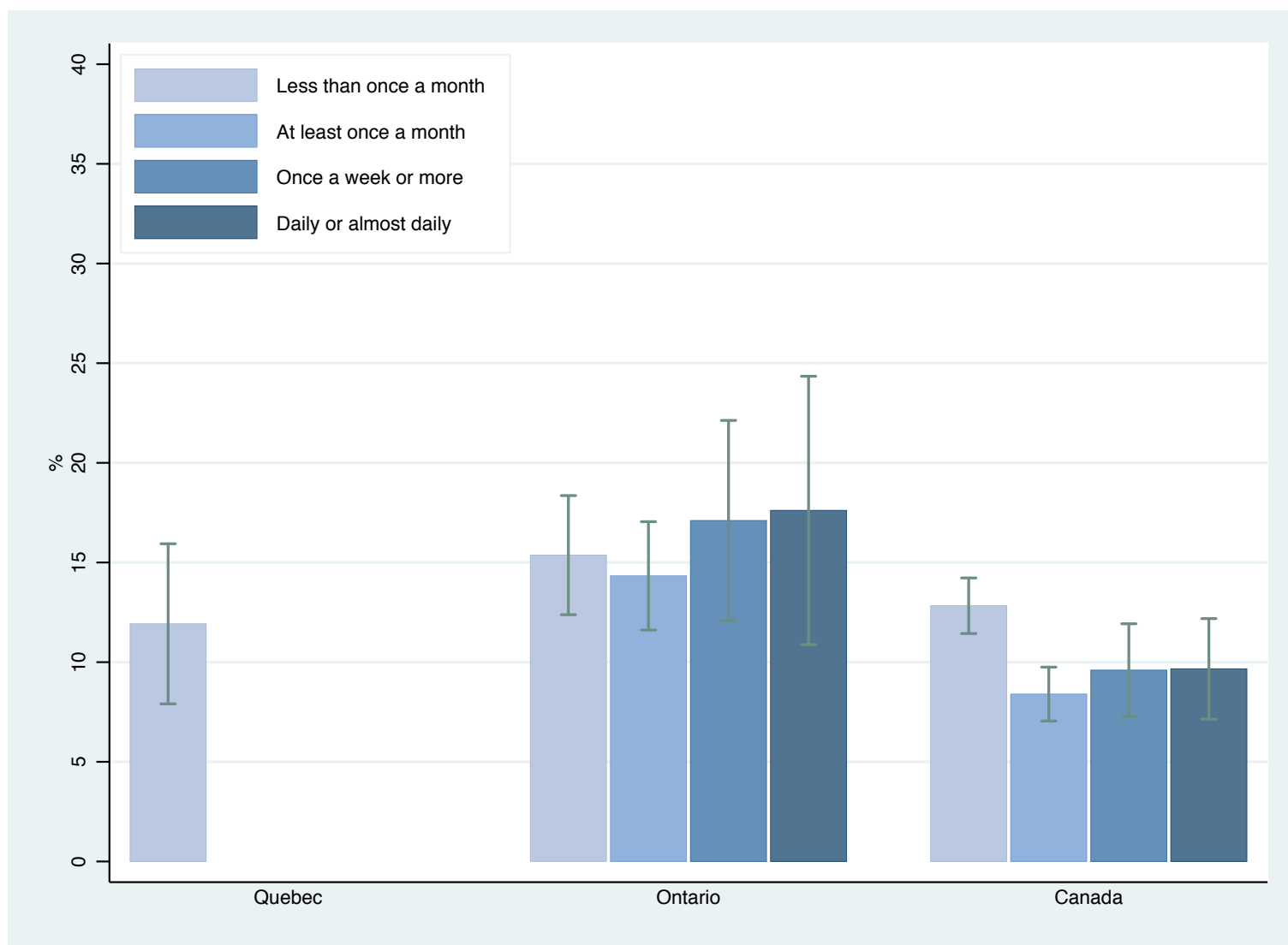

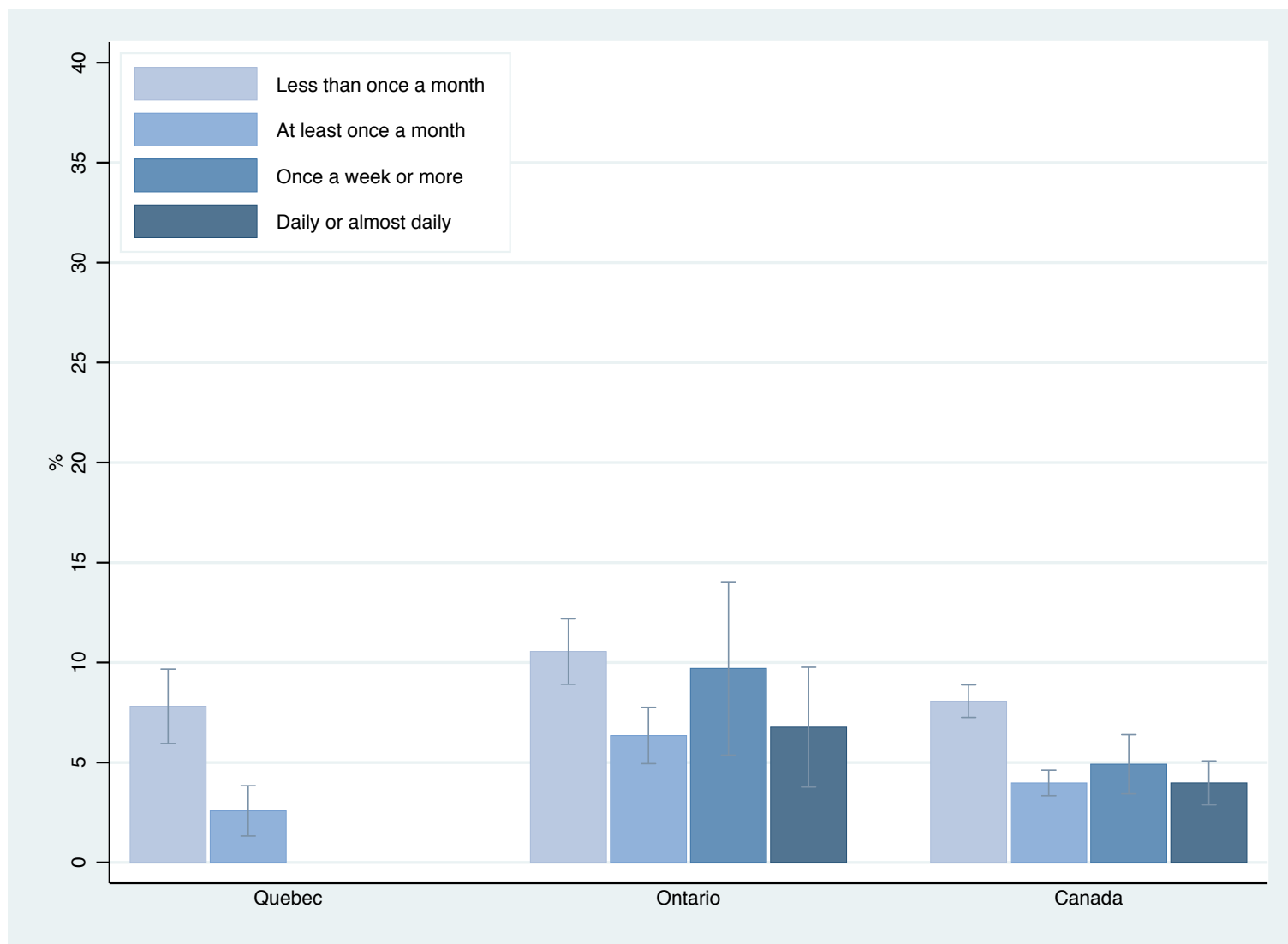

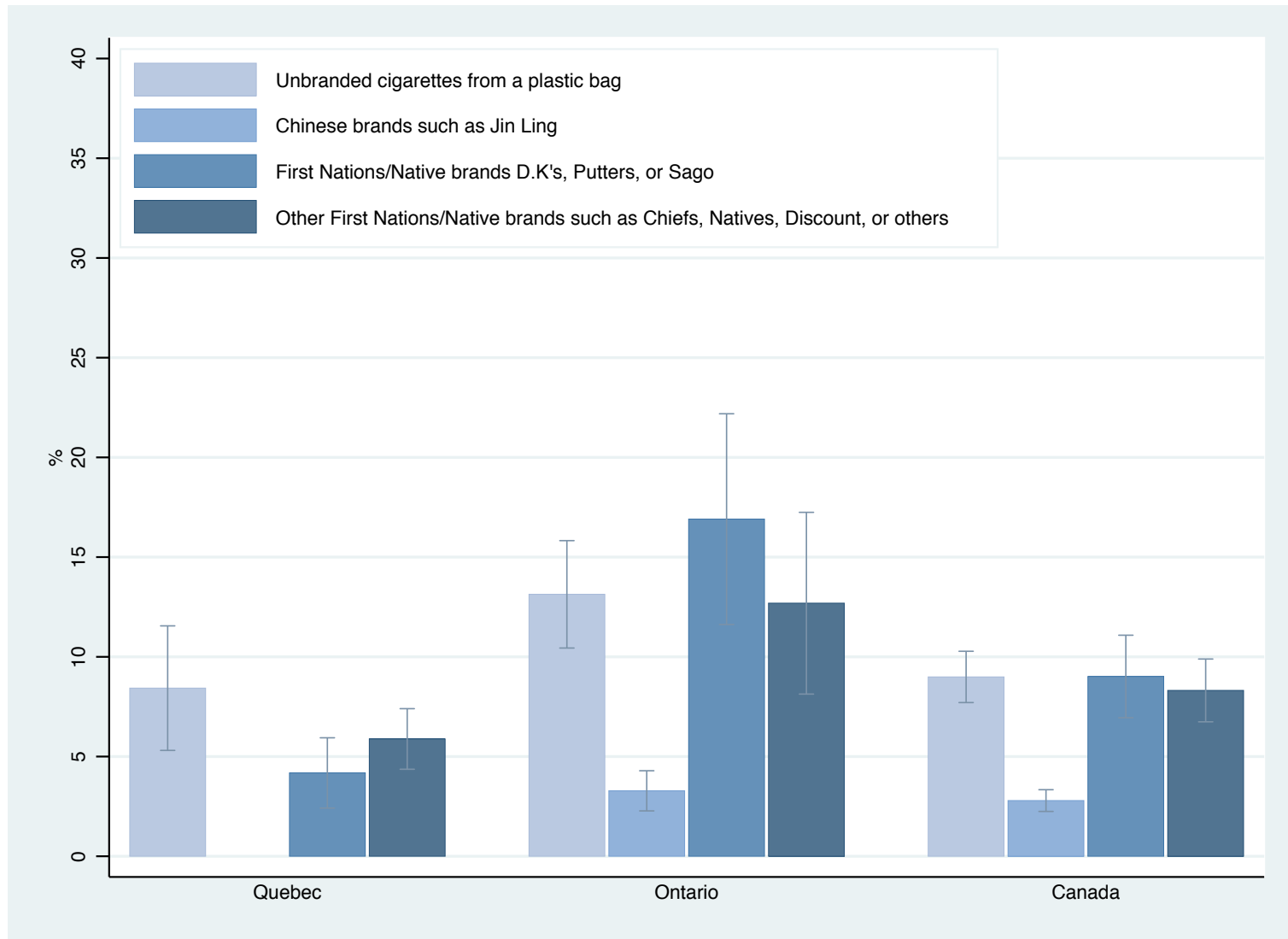
